HEALTH ADVICE A reminder that if your child has a bout of diarrhoea and/or vomiting (D&V) and to stop the spread of the virus, the Public Health Protection Team's advice is that you should allow 48 hours after the last bout of sickness or diarrhoea to ensure your child is clear of the bug. An infection is self-limiting and most people make a recovery in 1-2 days.

Please support us by emphasising to children about the importance of hand washing and the use of soap and water to promote good hygiene.

Please be re-assured that we are following statutory guidelines in keeping the school clean and free from any cross contamination of bacteria. We follow all public health procedures at the required intervals. The building is cleaned daily, surfaces wiped down, including door handles/rails and all areas are disinfected at the level permitted, including a deep clean every half term break.

AIR POLLUTION Some of you may have noticed the alerts saying that air pollution is currently at an unprecedentedly high level in London. This is due to the continuing high pressure and associated light winds across the UK. Here is the advice from Public Health England on how to respond during periods of high air pollution:

- Adults and children with lung problems, and adults with heart problems, should reduce strenuous physical exertion, particularly outdoors, and particularly if they experience symptoms
- People with asthma may find they need to use their reliever inhaler more often
- Older people should also reduce physical exertion (clearly this applies to adults not pupils!)
- Anyone experiencing discomfort such as sore eyes, cough or sore throat should consider reducing activity, particularly outdoors

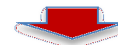
