

Yr3 Learning Letter - Friday 2nd February 2018


Valerie/Megha's Class

This week we have been building on our times table knowledge and even started to learn the eight times table by making a clear connection with the 2s and the 4s. Alongside learning the tables and chanting the multiples along to some fun tunes on Youtube, the children have been solving problems by applying their multiplication knowledge.

Our class has started reading with Bears (Reception), being their buddies! They enjoyed their first session and showed how mature they are now in year 3-making sure their little friends feel comfortable and understand what is being read to them.



Lots more history learning has happened this week. We have looked in even more detail at the way London has changed since the 18th century and the children have been able to draw clear comparisons between the different time periods. Everyone was shocked to learn about the blood sports that kept 18th century Londoners entertained. If you want to know more about this, ask your child! This then became geography learning as we looked at how London grew and plotted this on our own maps.
