- learning different strategies to help us solve multiplication and division number problems

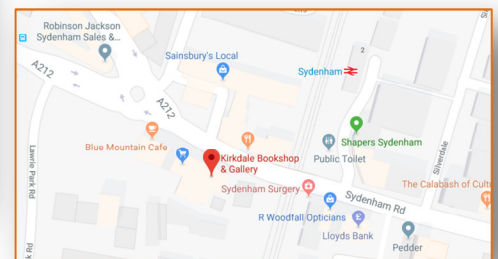
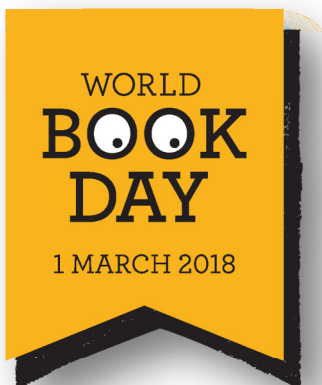

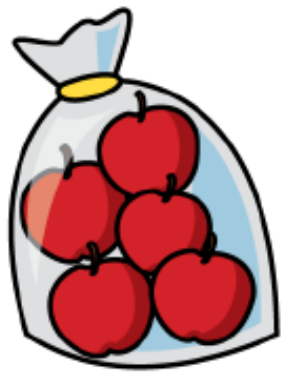


KSI Problem of the Day
