English

This week the children finished their newspaper reports about the assassination of Julius Caesar. As well as making sure they included direct and indirect speech, they used a variety of sentence structures and powerful vocabulary like 'bloodthirsy' to make their writing interesting for the reader. The children have really enjoyed learning how to structure a paragraph. They know that a paragraph is a group of sentences about one main idea and that it is made up of a topic sentence, supporting sentences and a closing sentence. Next week the children will be publishing their newspaper reports and distributing them across the school.

Maths

In Maths this week, the children have made a good start on creating their blueprints of their redesigned playground. They have drawn to scale what the playground looks like now with accurate measurements of perimeter which they themselves calculated when they went into the playground last week with their trundle wheels. They have also started plotting their new playground equipment taking into account given perimeter measurements ensuring that there is enough space for everything to fit. They needed to consider the surface ground area on the map; clearly label their map with perimeters and areas. Great resilience and teamwork has been shown during this challenge of which the children should be very proud. We have started to look at fractions of amounts and will consolidate this over the coming weeks. Have a go at some of the challenges below.


