Phonics

In Sophie's group we have been learning the alternative pronunciation for /c/ (cat and nice), /g/ (gold and magic) and /u/ (cut and unicorn). We have also been revising phase 4 and 5 tricky words to date.

In Sarah and Fiona's group this week we have been learning the alternative pronunciation for /ou/ (e.g. out, you, could, mould), /ch/ (e.g. chef and chief) and /y/ (by, daddy, yes and gym). We have also been focusing on the words, what, why, when, who, how and where and practising to write questions.

In Naomi's group we have been revising our phase 5 sounds and phase 4 tricky words.

In Leela's group we have been learning CCVC words (plum, snip, slug) and CCVCC words (plant, start, plank). We have also been practising writing phase 3 tricky words.

In Rez's group we have been writing short sentences with words including most of our phase 3 sounds and we have been learning tricky words such as 'what' and 'when'.
