






CLUB	CLUB LEADER	CLUB DETAILS
Football, Tennis 	Pro Stars (External provider)	Pro Stars have been coaching in schools for over ten years. They offer a well-structured lesson for boys and girls of all abilities with fun, safe sessions. All coaches are fully insured, licensed by the FA and dedicated to improving and encouraging young children to play sports. They currently deliver over 200 sports sessions across Bromley and Lewisham and specialise in ages 2 - 12 years, and are a Chartered Standard Club and one of only 10 FA Accredited Soccer Schools.
Contemporary Dance 	Georgina Perrott (teacher)	Classes will focus on contemporary dance technique, creativity, fitness & flexibility, working towards termly performances. Georgina is a contemporary dance specialist and also teaches whole-class curriculum dance from Reception to Y6.
Board Games 	Dominic Smyth (teacher)	Children can choose from and play a selection of strategic board and card games.
Gardening 	Eva Lee (external provider)	Eva has been a member of the Kilmore community for many years, her three boys having attended the school between 2002-2012. During this time she was a very active member of the Friends of Kilmore, frequently volunteered as 'head gardener' and has contributed greatly to the design and maintenance of our grounds. She continues to look after and improve our garden areas, teaching skills and nurturing a life-long love of gardening.
Science Club 	Shivani Frith (TA)	Explosions, potions, inventions, experiments and investigations.
Film Club 	Penny Malkin (TA) - Y1 & 2 Nyashia Blackburn (Teacher) - Y3 – 6	Children watch, discuss and review films.

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Hockey 	Sam Djavit (external provider)	<p>Sam has been coaching at Kilmorie school for over twenty years. Under his tutorage Kilmorie has been champions of Lewisham a record 5 times. Many Kilmorie children have played for Blackheath hockey club in Lewisham (the oldest club in the world). Sam coaches adults and children of all abilities from six-year-old beginners to under twenty one Great Britain internationals. His love of hockey reflects in his coaching. In hockey club the children learn skills through fun activities at the start and will also have the opportunity to take part in matches with their peers.</p>
Girls/ Boys Street Dance 	Mickey Wells - girls Antoinette John-Griffies – boys (external providers)	<p>The children learn street dance technique, routines, choreography and performance skills as well as improving their fitness and co-ordination.</p> <p>Mickey is a fitness instructor and dance teacher. She has taught dance at Kilmorie since her own children attended the school twelve years ago.</p> <p>Antoinette is a professional urban and contemporary dancer and teaches in schools and organizations across London.</p>
Code Club 	Alan Smith (teacher)	<p>Do you have a favourite computer game? Would you like to learn how to make your own computer games? At Code Club, you can learn how to make cool games and animations.</p>
Creative Writing 	Kate McAuliffe (teacher) Or Kay Boothman (TA)	<p>Writing and creativity inspired by the children's favourite books and authors.</p>
Arts & Crafts 	Jo Bourne (teacher)	<p>Junk modeling, painting, drawing and all things crafty & creative.</p>
Reading & Storytelling/ Story sack 	Sophie Prosser (teacher) – Y1 & 2 Liz Woodland (HLTA) - Reception	<p>Do you love stories? Children will listen to a chosen story each week and take part in discussion and related activities. Our reception children will use a 'story sack' approach, where well known fairy tales and stories are told through hands-on props, puppets and toys.</p>

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Steel Pans 	Chris McCartney (teacher)	Steel pans are musical instruments originating from Trinidad and Tobago. They emerged in the 1930s and are literally made from old junk – originally car parts, pots and pans and old dustbins. Now they are made from old oil drums that are hammered into a series of dents, creating pitched instruments. The children learn to play by ear (not with written down music) and will perform as an ensemble in our regular concerts.
Early Years Choirs 	Elizabeth Challenger (teacher)	Singing games, rhymes & songs for our youngest children. Developing singing & rhythm skills improves children’s co-ordination, listening and literacy skills as well as being a fun and social activity. Elizabeth joined Kilmorie as a piano teacher in 2017 and teaches music in our nursery as well as running our Early Years Choirs for Reception and Y1.
Chess 	CCF Chess (external provider)	CCF coaches chess in over 50 schools in several educational authority areas covering Kent, Middlesex and Surrey. In addition to the coaching, they have attached team and individual tournaments. Members of the club are invited to play in the Kent tournaments during the Autumn and Spring terms.
Art & Design 	Jan Roberts & Carole Christie (Teaching Assistants)	Children work with a range of mediums developing artist techniques, create work inspired by artists throughout history and explore their own creativity.
Football Y4-6 	Jane Catton (TA)	Jane Catton has championed team sports at Kilmorie for many years and inspires the children of all abilities to participate in a multitude of daily activities. She organizes and leads all our inter-school hockey, cricket and football tournaments. In our upper-phase football club children learn technique, teamwork skills and improve their fitness.
British Sign Language 	Kay Boothman (HLTA)	British sign language is a visual means of communicating using gestures, facial expression and body language. BSL is used mainly by people who are deaf or who have hearing impairments. It was officially recognized by the UK government in 2003 as an official minority language.
French 	Rez Holland (TA)	Children explore French culture and language through fun activities such as games, craft activities, songs, simple communicative exchanges and role-play. Rez Holland is a native French Speaker and an Early Years Teaching Assistant.

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Spanish 	Alessandra Stefano (TA)– Y3, 4, 5, 6	Children explore Spanish culture and language through fun activities such as games, craft activities, songs, simple communicative exchanges and role-play. Children are encouraged to express themselves from simple words to simple sentences both orally and in writing. Alessandra is a native Spanish speaker hailing from Venezuela and is an upper phase teaching assistant.
Upper & Lower Phase Choir 	Daisy Moon (Upper phase) Lauren Baker (Lower phase) (Teachers)	Our choirs learn vocal technique, melody and harmony and a repertoire of songs for termly performance. Our upper phase choir performs at a variety of in and out of school events such as Lewisham Live at the Broadway Theatre and Turning of the Year at Blackheath Halls and performs our annual musical production. Singing is inclusive, socially interactive and releases endorphins into the bloodstream relieving stress. Daisy Moon is a Leading Practitioner of Music and the Arts & Enrichment Leader. Lauren Baker is a cellist and African drumming specialist who also teaches our drum fun programme.
Drama 	Stretch Activities (external provider) - Y2/3 Penny Malkin (TA) - Reception	Drama classes focus on the development of speech and language encouraging children to gain confidence in and out of school. Each week the children will dive into an interactive story and come up with ideas to solve the mystery through imaginative play and make-believe. Stretch Activities is a family business founded in 2006 by Annabel Seares and Georgina Mitchell. Their team of dedicated teachers delivers children’s activities in a range of organisations across London.
Myths, Monsters & Legends 	Elaine Johnson (TA)	Exploring mythical creatures and legends through storytelling, drama, games and arts and crafts. Children will learn about well-known legends such as the Loch Ness Monster as well as inventing their own mythical creatures.
Junk Modelling 	Katrina Richardson (TA)	Building, making and creating with junk. Learning through creative play.

ENRICHMENT CLUB COSTS

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Clubs are run either by members of school staff or external tutors and fees vary depending on the resources required and the provider. All fees need to be paid via your ParentPay account.

PUPIL PREMIUM

All clubs are £10 per term for children in receipt of pupil premium funding (EITHER IN RECEIPT OF FREE SCHOOL MEALS OR HAVE BEEN IN THE LAST 6 YEARS). Please ask at the office if you are unsure if your child is eligible.

PAYMENTS/ INVOICES

Your child's club places and fees will be added to your child's ParentPay account and need to be paid by the deadline stated at application in order to confirm their place. Unpaid places will be offered to the waiting list.

Refunds will not be given once places are confirmed.

INSTRUMENTAL LESSONS

Instrumental lessons take place during the school day and are not listed in this brochure. Full information about instrumental lessons is available on the website and can be applied for via the website.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

- Clubs run for ten weeks per term. Exact dates are advised when application opens each term.
- Clubs need to be applied for online and paid for via parent pay.
- Clubs will be confirmed via your child's Parentpay account and lists are displayed in the school entrance.
- You **MUST** re-apply for enrichment clubs each term. Clubs are not rolled-over from previous terms.
- We are unable to issue refunds once places are paid for.
- Children must be signed out when collected from clubs - written permission is required if you would like your Y5 or 6 child to walk home independently.
- Please inform the office if your child is not attending a session for any reason when they are in school.
- Children attending activities are expected to behave appropriately and follow our school rules:
 - 1. Show respect, care and consideration to all**
 - 2. Challenge unacceptable, unkind behaviour**
 - 3. Care for our school environment**
 - 4. Demonstrate good learning behaviour**
- If the clubs are cancelled for any reason we will contact you either by phone or text as soon as possible.
- If a club is cancelled we endeavour to make this up with an additional week elsewhere. There are no refunds for inclement weather or circumstances beyond our control.
- All clubs have limited spaces and whilst we do our best to ensure equality and fairness, we cannot guarantee that children will get places in the clubs they request.
- Kilmorie is committed to safeguarding and all personnel engaged for the provision of enrichment clubs have undergone an enhanced DBS check and safeguarding training.
