Home – School Agreement



Alongside academic achievement, we strive to work as a community to help children develop the qualities shown above during their time at Kilmorie. The purpose of this home – school agreement is to identify and agree ways in which parents/carers, staff and children can work together to achieve this.

Our School Rules

In school, we expect all members of the school community (pupils, staff, parents and visitors) to be:

- Safe
- Respectful
- Ready to Learn

The school will:

- Provide a safe, stimulating environment where children feel confident to try new things, ask for help if they need it, take risks and work together to ask and find the answers to questions
- Ensure that the curriculum (which fulfils the requirements of the National Curriculum and EYFS curriculum), is engaging, purposeful and challenging. We want our curriculum to encourage creativity, curiosity and a love of learning
- Develop in each child positive values and a caring attitude towards the school community and the environment
- Communicate between home and school through the website, noticeboards, texts, emails and general meetings
- Welcome parents/carers whenever they visit the school and respond to their questions or concerns as quickly as possible
- Ensure that pupils receive appropriate home learning that supports their education and links to the school curriculum
- Provide a free book bag for every child who starts the school
- Contact parents/carers as soon as concerns are raised about their child's work, behaviour, attendance or punctuality

The parents/carers will:

- Ensure that their child attends school regularly, is punctual, properly equipped and ready to learn
- Raise any problems or concerns that might affect their child's ability to learn or behave appropriately
- Support and encourage their child with any home learning tasks or projects as well as listen to their child read at least 5 times a week (or in the case of older children encourage them to read daily and talk to them about the books they are reading)
- Support all staff in their efforts to create a caring community, which values children and their rights, raising any concerns in an appropriate manner with due respect to school policy
- Attend parents' meetings with the teacher to discuss their child's achievements and progress
- Inform the school immediately of any changes to parent or carer and emergency contact details
- Support the school to ensure their child maintains good behaviour
- Ensure that their child attends school in clothes that are appropriate for learning and weather

The child will:

- Fully participate in all lessons and demonstrate good learning behaviour
- Follow our school rules
- Care for our school environment
- Challenge unacceptable, unkind behaviour
- Care for our school environment and walk quietly around the school building
- Tell a member of staff if they are worried about anything
- Bring in their book bag every day (Reception on their nominated day) and read at home at least 5 times a week

All stakeholders will support the school's ban on SMARTPHONES for pupils.

Acceptable use of the internet: agreement for parents and carers

Online channels are an important way for parents/carers to communicate with, or about, our school. The school uses email and text messaging, as well as our website, to communicate with parents.

Parents/carers also set up independent channels to help them stay on top of what's happening in their child's class. For example, class/year Facebook groups, email groups, or chats (through apps such as WhatsApp).

There have been occasions when children, families and staff have been upset by inappropriate use of social media by certain members of our community. We urge you to follow the guidelines below:

- Use official school channels to communicate concerns of any kind, such as issues between children that occur in the playground or classroom; concerns about how the school has dealt with matters concerning your child
- Be respectful towards members of staff, and the school
- Be respectful of other parents/carers and children
- Use social media appropriately – please see guidelines below
- Personal social media should not be used to bring the school into disrepute
- Photos or videos of any child other than my own will not be uploaded or shared on social media, without the express permission of the other children's parents/carers (this is a safeguarding issue)
- The use of WhatsApp (or other similar apps) groups can cause upset, please be mindful of discussing specifics of any child, including something that has occurred between your child and another. Always direct enquiries to the school as we will conduct full investigations
- Criticisms of the school should in the first instance be brought to the school's attention rather than be discussed online

Any further concerns about the school's handling of a situation should be dealt with in line with the school's concerns and complaints procedure.

Libel or harassment of the school, other parents or staff online or otherwise will be taken seriously and reported to the relevant authorities.
