Settling In

- Home visits 8th, 11th or 12th September
- Children in school until 1.00pm for their first three days during staggered. (13th 14th and 15th September)

The New(ish) Curriculum

- The Early Years Foundation Stage (0-5 years)
- Learning is play based
- 3 Prime Areas: Communication and Language, Physical Development and Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- 4 Specific Areas: Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding the World and Expressive Arts and Design.
- We focus on how children learn
- Trips/Visits



Eating in School

- All children are offered a piece of fruit or vegetable everyday
- Children must bring in a filled bottle of water everyday
- The school provides milk
- There are 2 options for lunch school dinner and packed lunch from home
- NO NUTS please check packaging carefully



Food Allergies & Dietary Requirements

- You must inform the office first and they will inform staff
- It is your responsibility to check that medicine, including inhalers are in date
- Asthma medication and Epipens will be kept in the classroom for easy access.
 All other medication is administered by the office



Phonics



- The Government provided a list of approved schemes and after lots of research we chose Little Wandle Letters and Sounds
- They provide lots of useful information for parents on their website https://www.littlewandlelettersandsounds.org.uk/resources/for-parents/
- We want to settle the children with this new scheme and so will not begin their reading groups until October. However, they will still read phonics books 1:1 with their class adults
- We start with phonics books that have no words to encourage children to engage with the illustrations, be creative with their story telling and not overwhelm them with letters they do not know



Extras

- Book bags will contain your child's reading journal and two books (a phonics book and one of their choosing) Please send in on your child's designated reading day. Their reading days might change in October once they are reading in small groups
- Home Learning letters will be available every Friday
 on our website to inform you what your child has been
 learning, any suggestions of what you can do to support
 this at home, along with upcoming dates and requests.
 You must read this each week to keep up to date
- After-school activities start after Christmas for Reception



Extras continued...

These roles mean your child will be a focus of our observations that week. We will ask for you to share information (photos, wow cards etc.) and you will also have a meeting with the classroom adults to discuss their weeks learning and next steps.

Child of the Week

- Every child will have a turn
- They share their likes, dislikes, interests and help to plan activities
- Focus of our observations
- Another opportunity for parents to provide information or share concerns/queries (wow cards, Evidence Me

 an observation tool, information sheet and photos)

Manager/Special Helper

- Every child will have a turn
- Responsible for 'managing' the classroom e.g. checking children are tidying up, ensuring children are sat down and listen at certain times etc.

Class Pet

- Every child will have a turn
- Take cuddly toy home and write/make marks/draw pictures of their time
- Focus of our observations
- Another opportunity for parents to provide information

(Observation and Assessment Tracker) evidenceme


- Simple
