Dear Kilmorie Families,

What a wet week it has been! I hope you have all managed to stay dry where possible. At Kilmorie we have been dodging puddles and having some wet plays, but Year 6 Forest Learning and Reception's outside days have continued regardless. There have been some rather soggy looking people around this week.

On Thursday **Julie popped into school**. She managed to pop into a few classes and to catch up with a few pupils and staff in preparation for her return on Monday. Please be mindful that whilst she will be in every day, she won't be doing full days but is aiming to build up to full capacity over the next few weeks. It was great to see her and I am sure you will join me in welcoming her back, I know she is looking forward to getting back into the swing of things.

Last day of term: a reminder that the last day of term will be Friday 16th December. As we have for the last couple of years, we will be closing the school at 14:00. Please make sure arrangements are made to collect your child/ren at this time.

Enrichment clubs: the new timetable was sent to parents/carers on Monday, with a few new options, including classes for Reception children. To ensure availability for all, we kindly request that you only book a maximum of 3 classes for your child. Classes will be loaded to ParentPay at 7.30am on Tuesday 22nd November. If your child receives 1:1 support, please contact us prior to 22nd November so that we are able to arrange additional support if needed.

Assemblies: well done Kate's Class for another fabulous assembly this morning! The children lead the audience through 'a whole school day' covering a range of themes. They started with a focus on Zones of Regulation; going through the different zones and the emotions and strategies associated with each one. They then moved on to telling us key facts about their current History topic, the plague. Next was anti-bullying week and how important it was to look after others. Finally, they reminded the audience that it was Children in Need and reflected on the important work of this charity. The children were fabulous and we were impressed by the singing, dancing and acting of all the children. Well done Kate's class! Next Friday tit will be Vicky's class.



Anti-bullying week: It was wonderful to see so many children and staff wearing odd socks on Monday to kick off anti-bullying week by showing how different and unique we all are. During Kate's assembly (Lower Phase) we discussed what bullying means, how it affects people, the different roles involved in a bullying situation and how we can reach out to challenge it and change it.

During Simone's assembly (Upper Phase), she talked about the theme #REACH OUT for Anti-Bullying week 2022. Including:

- Different types of bullying, physical, verbal, emotional and also cyber-bullying
- How we can reach out and show each other the support we need
- How we all have a responsibility to help each other reach out
- If we challenge bullying, we can change it but it takes courage
- Who our 'trusted adults' in school could be
- We agreed to come together to reach out to help ourselves and others; to make Kilmorie school and community a kinder place to be



Trips and visits: Next week, Year 1 have a trip to Leeds Castle - please be bright and early as you are leaving promptly at 8:30 (make sure you arrive at school for 8:15). We will not be able to wait for latecomers. On Thursday Year 2 are visiting the Museum of London.
