


Year Two Home Learning Autumn 2, Week 3 18.11.22

This week....


- We have continued to learn about the Plague and find out facts to include in an information poster.
- We read 'Plague: A Cross on the Door' by Ann Turnbull which is a fictional story set during the summer of 1665. We found out so much, including:
 - A watchman would stand outside the homes of people with the plague. The people inside would lower a basket from an upstairs window to get supplies.
 - Church bells would ring for the dead.
 - Poultices were mixtures of herbs that were put on people's swellings.



- In Maths we have been consolidating number bonds to 10, 20 and 100.
- We have been adding and subtracting 1s from a 2-digit number using dienes and number lines.
- This week it has been anti-bullying week. We had an assembly on Monday that introduced this year's theme, 'Reach Out'. In class we have been talking about bullying and thinking of what we can do if we are affected by bullying.
