Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been an absolute privilege to be at the helm again this week and I am pleased to be writing to you again about all the fabulous things that have been going on in the school. As always it has been a busy one!

Visits: I firstly wanted to say an enormous THANK YOU to all the staff who took the Year 6 children to JCA last week. Being a seasoned 'school journier' I know that there is no tiredness like school journey tiredness. It is incredibly rewarding but totally shattering and the staff do really work 24 hours a day.

Class visits have also been taking place this week. Once Monday's rain subsided, the weather was lovely for the trips on Monday and Tuesday when the Year 4s went to Crystal Palace park for a visit linked with their current art project. Two year 5 classes also visited the Royal Courts of Justice today and had a wonderful visit learning all about our judicial system, which links to their topic on Crime and Punishment. Conor's Class will be visiting later in the term.

Also, this week, the Year 3 classes have had educational workshops delivered by One Day Creative, which was linked in with their geography topic on volcanoes and earthquakes. This active-learning, quiz-style workshop encouraged children to use their collaborative skills and allowed them to consolidate the fabulous learning they had been doing in class. The facilitators encouraged them to use their bodies to explore and answer questions.

Parents' events: you should all have received information about the <u>parents' evening</u> meetings taking place the week commencing 7th November. Please go on to your child's Class Team to sign up for your slot.

Don't forget to attend our <u>open classrooms</u> during the week commencing 31st October.

On Thursday 20th October, the Early Phase team will be delivering phonics training to Reception and Year 1 parents in line with our new phonics scheme Little Wandle. It would be lovely to see many of you there.

Assemblies: on Monday we celebrated World Mental Health Day by wearing yellow and today we have celebrated Just One Tree Day by wearing green. What a colourful week it has been! In Monday's assembly Simone and Kate M (our



wellbeing leads) delivered an assembly which included both of these topics – looking after ourselves and our world!

While showing our support for World Mental Health Day we reminded the children that how they feel matters and what they can do if they need support with their wellbeing. Some of the children shared some quotes from, *The Boy, the Mole, the Fox and the Horse*, a beautiful book about four friends who share a series of heartfelt and profound conversations about life and friendship. Children also share their personal experiences of what they have done when their feelings are bothering them.

Sarah R's class did our very first class assembly of the year and what an assembly it was! The children sang songs, did dances and recited their many lines brilliantly. It was really lovely to hear about all the great learning they have been doing this half term all about Ancient Egypt. Thank you to everyone who attended it was lovely to see so many people there.

Next Thursday 20th October will be the turn of **Elis'** Class. I hope to see lots of you there too.

Home learning consultation: as you may know we are currently reviewing our home learning policy. We would be very grateful if you would complete the short <u>consultation</u>. It should only take about a minute to complete. It will be available until end of the school day on Monday 31st October. Thank you in advance for your time.

Secondary Transfer: A quick reminder for Year 6 parents that the deadline for you to submit your applications for secondary school is <u>Monday 31st October</u>. Make sure you sign up before the deadline as late applications are put to the back of the queue and all applications submitted on time are given priority.

Pick up and drop off: I would like to remind you about expectations around drop off and pick up.

At drop off in the morning:

- Only Year 4 6 children are permitted to be left unaccompanied by an adult and these year groups go straight to class when the first bell goes at 8:50.
- When the first bell goes at 8:50 children in Years 2 and 3 make their way to the line. This is your opportunity to converse with the teacher if you need to.

At pick up, all children must inform their teacher of who is picking them up for safeguarding reasons. If you see that your child has not done this, please encourage them to do so.

Changes to pick up person: Please let the office know in advance of changes to pick up. If you contact the office after 3pm we cannot guarantee the message will get to the teacher in time, therefore the teacher will need to bring your child (& the person collecting them) to reception to check. We hope you understand that we do this as a safeguarding measure.

Toilets: I understand that there has been some discussion around toilets this week. I want to inform you that in Year 1 there are unisex toilets; in the playground classroom (Sarah C's) there are also unisex toilets as there is only one; all other year groups have separate toilets for boys and girls.

Kilmorie staff: I am sad to announce that next week Gabi will be leaving us next Wednesday as she will be returning to her previous area of employment - media. She is looking forward to exploring new challenges and have a job that fits in well with all the demands of family life. Gabi has thoroughly enjoyed working in Reception for the last few years. I am sure you are all with me in wishing her all the best in her new job and thanking her for all her hard work during her time here. Don't be a stranger Gabi – do come back and visit us.

As you know, Julie has been off this week. I have sent her our good wishes and am pleased to say she is recovering well.


Christmas Fair Callouts:
