Dear Parents and Carers,

Assembly this week: Kate led assembly this week around the importance of manners. They looked at how good manners show gratitude, set you apart and make you more likeable and memorable, as well as how people judge you by their first impression and good manners show respect. By practicing basic good manners, we are showing those around us that we respect them and are considerate to their feelings. This makes them feel better, and us too.

Contact Information: It is very important that the contact information we hold with respect to your child is always up to date as we regularly send out text messages, emails and letters with important information about your child and school.

We will be sending you your child(ren)'s current contact information; please can you check everything is correct, sign and return, or if anything has changed, update the information on the contact information form and sign and return. All forms need to be returned signed; it is vital you let us know, so we can ensure all information we hold is correct.

New Fence: Further to a bid last year, Lewisham have been replacing our falling down fences at both the front and the back of the school. This was originally planned for the half term week; however, it was suddenly brought forward to this week! The front of the school (Kilmorie Road) has been replaced with metal mesh which looks very smart and is more secure. However, it is also rather open and Benita and myself are looking into options to make it feel less exposed. One idea we have had is to create fence art using the Kilmorie qualities alongside some foliage and we are talking to Eva about options.

School Trips: Year 6 have been on their residential this week, which I hear has been enormous amounts of fun and I look forward to catching up with them upon their return. Next week class trips are beginning with Year 4s who will be off on a visit to Crystal Palace as part their art project about sphinxes. Followed by Year 5s (Ayo's and Vicky's classes) taking a trip to the Royal Courts of Justice in support of their Crime and Punishment topic. Conor's class will have this trip in November.

Monday, 10th October 2022 is World Mental Health Day,

with the theme 'Make Mental Health and Wellbeing for all a Global Priority'. To mark the day, the charity 'YoungMinds' is calling on schools to take part in their #Hello Yellow campaign by wearing something yellow, to show young people that how they feel matters, and to help us create a future where all young people get the mental health support they need, when they need it, no matter what.

Mental Wellbeing is a very important part of Kilmorie life and during next Monday's assembly for World Mental Health Day we will be reminding the children of ways they can look after their mental health. There will also be a focus in class during the week on activities that promote positive mental health and inclusivity. We would like to mark the day by inviting all children to wear something yellow into school on Monday, 10th October, to promote the message of positivity (it can just be a pair of yellow socks, or a yellow dot attached to their T-shirt). Early Years Outside Area: Archer Landscapes Ltd will be returning to the school w/b 10th October to carry out phase 2 of the works for the upgrade to the Early Years outside play area. This will be taking place in the area that currently houses the playhouse and this will be cordoned off from staff and children. During these works, access will be cut off to the door next to the Premises Office, therefore parents dropping off children at the nursery / reception and in the main playground will need to go around using the alleyway.

Open mornings and parents' evening: A letter has been sent this week outlining the forthcoming open classroom mornings; these will give you an opportunity to see some independent learning and time for your child to talk you through their books. We are excited to be able to do this and look forward to welcoming you into the classrooms. In conjunction with this, next week we will be sending out details outlining parents' evening allocations for you to book a slot.

Children's clothing: Please can I ask that you make sure your children have suitable footwear on as we have had children coming to school wearing Heelys (with the wheels in so they couldn't walk) and wearing football studs.

When it is their PE day, it is important that the children in the Upper Phase who are not changing for PE are wearing suitable clothing and trainers to school, to ensure they can participate in PE. Children in Year 3 and below should still be changing into a suitable PE kit in school. Children should not be wearing any jewellery other than stud earrings on any day for safety and will be asked to remove watches for PE; we ask that you do not let your child wear anything that is precious as we are unable to be responsible for these items. Hair that is shoulder length or longer needs to be tied back for PE. Thank you for your support with this.

JUST ONE tree is an award-winning non-profit community interest company removing CO2 from the atmosphere and reversing biodiversity loss through global reforestation. The charity supports established reforestation companies to plant in areas severely affected by mass deforestation such as Kenya, Madagascar, Haiti & Indonesia. By doing this they have the greatest positive effect on limiting global warming whilst simultaneously alleviating extreme poverty within local communities through the provision of training, agricultural education and sustainable incomes. Last year we supported this charity and are planning to again this year. On Friday 14th October we are encouraging children to wear something green (This could be socks, a hair band, or a coloured dot attached to their T-shirt) and bring in £1 to fund the planting of their tree.

Class Assemblies are back! Next week Sarah R's class will be having their class assembly giving us a wonderful snapshot of their learning. I am sorry I won't be here to see it but look forward to hearing all about it.
