Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have had a lovely week.

Assembly this week: On Monday Dennis led the assembly, introducing Black History Month. He spoke about his personal educational journey through history, highlighting the issue that it was predominately `white history`. He highlighted this by asking a question to the school - `How many black inventors can you name`? Dennis then looked to redress this by highlighting the contribution of black people throughout history, from John Blanke to Walter Tull to Billy Strachan. He finished by emphasising that `white history` cannot be taught in a month, similarly `black history` cannot either. Whilst October is a time to celebrate Black History, our study of black history is not be confined to October but throughout the year.

Congratulations: Whilst data outcomes do not represent the whole child and their achievements, they are important to a child's life chances. Last year's results were particularly important as they follow the two very disrupted years our children have had. For all of the statutory assessments (Early Years Good Level of Development (GLD), Phonics, end of Key Stage 1, Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check and end of Key Stage 2), we are once again **above both Lewisham and National**. Writing continues to be an area that requires focus, both Nationally and within Kilmorie. I am sure you will join me in saying a massive congratulations to everyone for the hard work in supporting all children to achieve their best possible outcomes.

Absence: I will be absent from school from Monday 10th October as I will be having some medical treatment. The following has been put in place for my absence:

- W/b 10th October, Kate will lead the school Monday, Thursday & Friday. Dennis will lead Tuesday & Wednesday
- W/b 17th October, Dennis will lead Monday & Tuesday and Kate will lead Wednesday Friday
- After half term, Kate will lead the school Monday Wednesday and Dennis Thursday & Friday. I will hopefully be working
 from home; however, it will be on reduced hours as I build my strength back up
- It is currently planned that I will return to school w/b 21/11/22

If you need to speak to the 'Head' during my absence please contact either Kate or Dennis, who I am confident will be able to effectively deal with anything you have raised. However, the Assistant Headteachers for your child's phase are also a good place to go to, if you wish to discuss anything that the class teacher is unable to deal with. I would also like to thank you in advance for your support to both myself and the leadership team.

Parking in Elsinore Road: I have had a neighbour ask if parents could be mindful of using Elsinore Road to park and to be careful when doing so. There have been incidents of cars getting damaged and residents, of the flats, finding it hard to park when returning from night shifts; thank you for your cooperation.

Year 6 School Journey: Next week the year 6 children are off to Condover Hall in Shropshire. The staff members who will be accompanying are: Jo C, Dennis, Dominic, Shivani, Kay and Jane R. I am sure you will join me in wishing them a fabulous week – lets hope the rain stays away for them. I look forward to hearing all about it upon their return.

Keeping Your Child Safe Online: It has reported to us that an adult has been contacting a child online through Roblox, using emotive language and sending persuasive messages. If your child is contacted inappropriately online, the most important thing to do is to block the user and report the incident.
