Assembly

This week, Dennis our new Assistant Headteacher for Inclusion led Monday's assembly. I have included a photo as some of you may not have met him yet. They looked at both internal and external disabilities. He spoke about how many people have 'internal' or 'hidden' disabilities, those that cannot obviously be seen. The children offered many examples of people they know with a range of different 'hidden' conditions such as dyslexia, diabetes, ASC (Autistic Spectrum Condition) and multiple sclerosis. They thought about how we should support and help the people around us, should they need it.



The second half of the assembly was focused on <u>World Afro Day</u>, which is a day to celebrate and educate Afro hair, culture and identity. We spoke about how and why this day originated.
