This week:

* We developed our skills around asking and writing questions about why Bob needs to clean the moon.

*We practised our dance movements as rockets, astronauts and planets in the playground, modelling our space belts that we had designed and made.

* We used our phonics knowledge to write about our space day.

* We learnt how to count in multiples of 10 to 100, we made groups of 10 with pictures and wrote numerals focusing on the multiples of 10.

For home learning, you can...

Phonics

In phonics we have - have been investigating alternative spelling patterns for u/ o-e/, o/ ou for example: touch, son, above, the alternative spelling pattern for z/se for example cheese, and the alternative spelling pattern for s/se for mouse, ce for fence, ee/ ey for donkey.

We have also been learning to read and write the tricky words: 'people, your, their, thought, through, friend, and work'
