We have continued our focus on reading familiar fairy tales, stories and nursery rhymes. The children again loved reading with their Year 6

Reading Buddies. On Tuesday we made fairy cakes and the children loved weighing, mixing and spooning out the mixture into cases before baking in the oven. After cooling the cakes were dribbled with colourful icing before taking home. The children were so excited to eat them that not many made it home!
