RE: International Week

In support of bringing our community together, we have dedicated time next week to celebrate some of our pupils' heritages and nationalities during our International Week.

This term, Sam and Emily have been working with children across the school looking at music from around the world. For some year groups, this has been delivered in a whole class setting, while for others it has been in smaller groups. We would like to invite you to a selection of performances: solos from some of our piano students due to take an exam; whole-class performances and a selection of pieces from enrichment clubs. Please see detailed timetable attached. Please note these performances will not be ticketed, but for health and safety reasons when we reach the limit of capacity in the hall, we will not permit anyone further.

In addition to the performances, all year groups have been assigned a country to focus their learning around and will be doing a selection of activities such as designing a promotional leaflet, cooking a dish from the country or researching and replicating an artist. What is produced will be displayed in communal corridors around the school. On Thursday 30th March, we are inviting all children to come to school dressed in their national or heritage dress, flag colours or colours from the flag of the country they are learning about. Whilst only a selection of countries are being focussed on during our International Week, with the help of Friends of Kilmorie (FoK), we are purchasing a flag for every nationality represented within our school community so that they can be displayed throughout the building.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Friends of Kilmorie for their continued support, as they are also providing resources (including ingredients) for the activities we have planned for next week.
