For cooking this week we've also started to get 'all international' in preparation for International Day on Thursday and we made Mexican enchiladas. First the children explored ingredients and identified the vegetables, including aubergine, peppers and onions. We also smelled the mild chilli powder and cumin seeds and listened to the vegetables sizzling in the pan.



Chopping, grating, snipping and stirring are fantastic exercises for developing coordination and finger/ hand muscles and we are so proud that the children are also becoming superb turn takers! The children ate the enchiladas sitting together and we were delighted so many were prepared to try something new – Well done!



The children remain fascinated by the tadpoles. We're down to the last few now and they are growing incredibly quickly. Look out for their legs beginning to grow during your visit on International Day on Thursday.
