This week in Reception

It's been another exciting week in Reception as we have been busy preparing for our upcoming performance of 'The Little Red Hen'. The children have been practising retelling the story, singing songs, and making props to bring the story to life. We have also been creating our own story maps of the 'Little Red Hen' tale, helping us to explore the plot and characters.

In addition to our focus on 'The Little Red Hen', we have been celebrating Earth Day this week. We discussed the different ways we can look after the planet and learnt about the importance of recycling by making things using junk modelling. The children came up with some fantastic ideas for how we can all do our part to help protect the environment.

Phonics:

In phonics, we have been focusing on longer words which include double letters such as hammer, rubber and rabbit. We've also been practising the tricky words full, push, and, go and no. The children have been doing an excellent job with their phonics and are making great progress.

Maths

This week in maths we were focusing on subitising (recognising quantity by sight). The children explored this by subitising and making their own patterns of 6 and used their knowledge of doubles to help them subitise numbers up to 10. We also practised counting things that can not be seen such as the beat of a drum and the sound of objects dropping into a bucket.

Next Week:

Next week we will be learning all about the King's Coronation. We will be making crowns, flags, and sceptres in preparation for the big day and learning all about the history of the Coronation. We are excited to explore this topic and see where our learning takes us.
