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Year 6 Assessment – End of Year.

There has been some confusion with the different forms of assessment that parents have received over the last week. Hopefully this email will address any confusion.

When you received your child's school report last week you would have seen the following for Reading, Writing, Maths and science:

This table shows the teacher assessment for your child in the given subject and is based on our internal assessment system.

You would also have received your child's SATS results:

In terms of the statutory assessment (SAT) result, a child either:

- meets the expected standard when they achieve a scaled score of 100 or more or
- they have not met the expected standard if their scaled score was below 100.

Children achieving a scaled score of 110 or more are deemed as working at greater depth within the expected standard.

It is likely that a child who scores a scaled score of 110 or more would have been teacher assessed as above the expected standard. However, the outcome of the test does not always match the teacher assessment due to the conditions of the test that day.

This can be seen in the example below where the two don't match as the child has been assessed at working at expected standard. In their test they achieved a scaled score of 110 – which means that they are working at Greater Depth within the expected standard.

This could also be where the teacher has assessed a child at working at greater depth but their test result has a scaled score of below 110.
