This week in Reception:

It has been a very busy week in Reception and I'm sure that, like us, you are all extremely proud of how your children have adapted to the longer days and new routines of 'big school'. Our focus at the beginning of term is always on settling the children and ensuring that they feel safe and confident in the school environment. We have done this by slowly introducing the different areas of the learning environment, both inside and out, and spending short carpet sessions playing circle games to find out more about the children and who they are as individuals, including their likes and dislikes.

The children have been very excited to explore all the areas of Reception, especially the outside area which seems to be particularly popular this year! They have managed lunchtimes well and are impressing us all with their independence when selecting food and carrying their own trays to the table.

Phonics:

This week we jumped straight into our Little Wandle phonics programme by introducing the children to the phonemes for s, a, t and p. We did this by introducing items that begin with the sounds, such as a snake for s. The children were very enthusiastic and it's lovely to note that some continued to spot things beginning with these sounds in their free play after the phonics session.

Weekly Learning Letter

Maths / Number:

We have not yet begun teaching any formal maths sessions as we initially think it is important to focus on doing settling activities for the children, such as the circle games mentioned above. However, we have observed the children using lots of maths in their play including measuring quantities when playing in the water tray, using the large scales to weigh items, measuring their heights against wall charts and counting toys in their play. We have also counted the children each time they line up and taken opportunities to sing familiar counting songs with them, which they love.

Reading:

Next week we will begin our Little Wandle reading programme. Although many children will continue to read individually at this point, some will begin to read in groups. Initially, each of the children will receive a wordless, or almost wordless picture book to bring home. This is to encourage the children to gain confidence in looking at books. Please encourage your child to talk about what they see in the pictures and 'read' you the story.

Home learning ideas:

Play a game of i-spy using the sounds the children have learnt this week (s, a, t, p). Please use letters sounds, not letter names.
