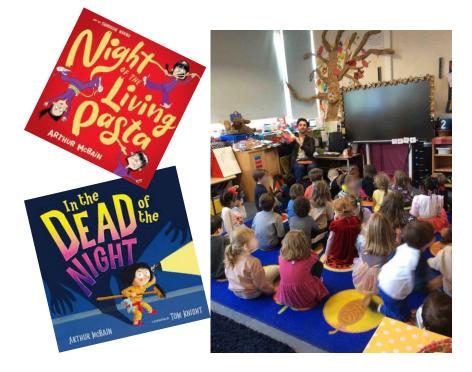
Weekly Learning Letter
