# **Weekly Learning Letter**

## Friday 12th January 2024

## This week in Year 1:

#### English:

In English this week, Year 1 have been introduced to the story 'Traction Man' by Mini Grey. The children have written sentences describing their favourite toys and practised imitating the 'voiceover' narration from the story with their learning partners.

#### **Phonics:**

This week the children have been learning the alternative spellings of graphemes that they already know. We have introduced 'y' (hairy, smelly), 'ea' (head, bread), 'wh' (whisper, wheel), oe/ou (toe, goes, boulder). We have also introduced the tricky words: any, many, again.

#### **Maths**

In maths this week, the children have been learning about teen numbers and how they are made up of tens and ones. We have looked at 10 in different ways and learnt that a group of ten can be fixed e.g. a diene, numicon piece, or broken into 10 ones e.g. 10 multilink pieces, 10 counters.

#### **Computing:**

In computing this week, the children have been learning about floor robots and will have a go at using the buttons on a Beebot to program it to move in different directions.

#### <u>RE:</u>

The children have been learning about the Islamic faith and the prophet Mohammed and why he is important to Muslims.
