



Weekly Learning Letter

Friday 22nd March 2024

This week in Reception:

It has been another busy week in Reception. On Thursday, we celebrated world poetry day and the children liked listening to different styles of poems and even writing their own acrostic poems using their names as inspiration. The children have also enjoyed learning about Ramadan and the ways in which this is observed. The children liked learning about how the day that Ramadan starts is dependent on the sighting of the new crescent moon. The children learnt about the different phases of the moon, and this led to some children creating paintings to represent each phase. The children created beautiful representations of Mosques using dried beans, rice and pulses to decorate them. On Thursday, we also celebrated World Down Syndrome Day, the children talked about what makes each of us unique and they loved designing their own socks inspired by who they are. On Friday, the children learnt about the importance of saving water and discussed the things that we could do to use less water. Some of the children even made their own water saving machines out of junk modelling.

Phonics:

Giraffes: We have been practising the digraphs **ar** (park, dark, farm) and **or** (horn, born, torn) and the trigraph **igh** (light, night, high). This culminated in a fun recap games session on Friday with a sound sort and a game of In the Bin.

Unicorn Dinosaurs: In phonics this week, we focused on longer words ending in **-ing** (marching, morning, waiting) and practising using the chunk it up method. We also practised writing sentences that included the tricky words **is**, **she**, **he**, **my** and **they**.

T-Rex: In phonics this week, we focused on longer words ending in **-ing** (singing, swimming, lightning) and compound words such as (rooftop, carpark, popcorn) we also did lots of writing practice, including writing sentences that include the new words we had learnt.

Maths / Number

This week in maths we learnt about 3D shapes. The children talked about the properties of a cube, cuboid, cone and sphere and liked challenging their friends to guess the 3D shape they were describing. As well as this, they enjoyed going on a

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3D shape hunt around the classroom and outdoor area, trying to see if they could find any of the shapes they had learnt about in their environment.

Home learning ideas:

- See if your child can write an acrostic poem about a family member or friend.
- Go on a 3D shape hunt around your local area.
- Use junk modelling to make a machine that helps us save water or to help us clean our oceans.

Reminders

Sickness and absence

There has recently been a high incidence of sickness across the year group including a sickness and vomiting bug, as well as a virus that causes an extremely high temperature. The latter, seems to come on very quickly with the child's temperature suddenly spiking.

With this current situation in mind and how contagious this virus appears to be, should your child have a slight temperature before school we strongly recommend that you keep them off until they are well. However, if you do decide that your child is well enough to attend school and give them Calpol, please ensure you notify one of the adults in their class at drop-off. We will then know to monitor your child more closely.

Likewise, with sickness and vomiting, please ensure that your child stays at home until 48 hours after their last bout of sickness.

Holi Celebration – we're getting messy!

On Thursday 28th March, the final day of the school term, we will be celebrating the Hindu festival of Holi by throwing powder paint outside. Please dress your child appropriately, in clothing that you do not mind getting messy. Although, this paint is washable and we encourage the children to throw the paint on the ground, they will inevitably get a little messier than usual and we would hate for anybody to be upset about special clothing.
