This week in Reception:

We have made it to the end of the Spring term and what a lovely, fun and wonderful term it's been! The children have continued to develop their love of school and it has been great to watch them making progress in all areas of their learning. We can't wait to see what new challenges and adventures the new term will bring!

This week, the children have been learning about two different religious festivals; the Christian celebration of Easter and the Hindu festival of Holi. These festivals have been the impetus for all kinds of activities and learning including making Easter baskets, decorating eggs, making chocolate nests, drawing henna designs and thinking about the similarities and differences between different religious festivals. The week culminated in a paint throwing event outside, to replicate the Holi celebrations we have seen in videos from India. The children loved this, truly sensory, experience as the rain began to pour midway through our paint throwing party! Even those children who preferred not to be directly involved, enjoyed watching the mayhem unfold from the safety of 'homie' (an area of the playground that we deemed paint-free!)

Phonics:

This week in phonics the children stayed in their own classrooms, we used this time to review all the Phase 3 sounds and practised blending shorter and longer words. We also spent time writing down all the tricky words that we have learnt so far and played games to help the children remember all the new tricky words like **sure, all, she, he, they, me, me...**

The children have loved applying their phonics knowledge to their writing and we have seen their interest in writing grow this term, well done reception!

Maths / Number

This week in number we have enjoyed using white boards to write numbers and to talk about the many ways that we can represent them. The children summarised their learning this term using their language to express their number knowledge. They said: '2 and 2 makes 4', '6 is bigger than 4 because 4 can hide behind 6' or '7 is one more than 6'.





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Home learning ideas:

We're sure you will have noticed that your children are extremely tired at the moment and due a good rest! With this in mind, we only suggest that you keep reading regularly with your child (doing your best to ensure that it is a fun and relaxing activity for you both) and make the most of the improving weather by trying to get outside into your local park. Perhaps your child can share some facts about Spring with you? We will therefore be sending a Bug Club book home for your child to practise reading over the holidays and will resume normal reading groups during the first week of the new term. We will also provide each of you with the login information for our online Little Wandle reading resource on your child's return to school after the holidays. The teachers will then be able to allocate a range of online books for your child to enjoy at home.
