



Weekly Learning Letter

Friday 3rd May 2024

<u>English</u>

This week, we have been creating our own animal poems written in the style of 'The Sound Collector' by Roger McGough. The children imagined that they were a sound collector in a zoo and thought about what animals they could hear and the sounds those animals make. They then used these sounds to write a poem in 4-line verses with some children trying to rhyme the second and fourth line in each verse. The children did brilliantly!

Maths

This week, the children continued their learning on multiplication. They learned about equal and unequal groups, adding equal groups and making arrays. These are all building blocks for formal multiplication methods as the children progress through the school.

<u>PE</u>

The children have continued taking part in Multiskills. The lesson focused on changing direction and body position. The children did a variety of activities where they had to negotiate space and change their body position to retrieve objects. They worked together in teams so there was plenty of opportunity to discuss cooperation and sportsmanship.

<u>RE</u>

We started our unit on The Natural World. We looked at natural objects and how they are all unique. We discussed how different people hold different beliefs about how the world was created and how some religions believe in a God or Creator.

Geography

This week, we started looking at the continents of the world. The children looked at maps of the world and discussed how continents are made up of lots of countries. We sang the continents song and then located the continents on maps.





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Next week we will be:

English: Starting our new unit on the Snail and the Whale. Familiarising ourselves with the books and doing some work on adjectives.

Maths: Making equal groups, sharing and doubles.

Geography: Looking at different continents in more detail.

Art: Continuing our work on making birds – using different materials to make bird sculptures.

RE: What do Jews and Christians believe about the creation of the world?


