Year 1 Home Learning

It has been another great week in Year 1, and the children continue to impress us with how they are settling into their new classes. We want to thank you for your support with this transition.

English

This week we have focused on retelling the story of the 'Three Little Pigs'. The children are now familiar with the language used in their story and using it during drama activities.

Maths

In Maths the children have practised:

Subitising - to subitise means instantly recognising the number of objects in a small group, without counting.

Conservation - recognising that if nothing has been added or taken away from a group, then the amount is the same.

Using **numerals** to represent number, understanding that a **numeral** is a symbol or name that stands for a number.

Using **ordinal numbers** to describe position, e.g. first, second, third, fourth, fifth

PSHE

This week we have been learning about using the toilet correctly and respecting the bathroom environment.

Outdoor Learning – Wild Garden

For our wild garden session this week, our school gardener Eva taught the children about the different plants we have growing in our playground. At the end of the session each class had time to explore the wild garden.
