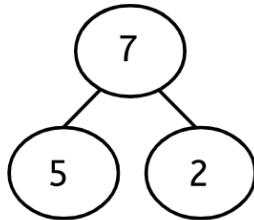

Our learning this week

Maths

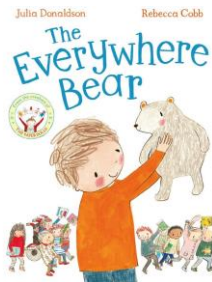


We have been learning about the composition of numbers from 6 to 9. These numbers can be partitioned into 5 and a bit. For example, if the whole is 6, this can be partitioned into parts of 5 and 1. The number 7 can be partitioned into 5 and 2 etc. We used the part part whole model to show this.

Practise partitioning numbers into 5 and a bit. Challenge: Can you partition a 2-digit number?

English and Geography



We have a new book – The Everywhere Bear by Julia Donaldson. In the story, the bear travels to lots of different places. We had a visit from Paddington Bear. Paddington has been travelling around the different countries of the UK and sending us letters from the capital cities. His first stop was London where he visited several landmarks. The children located London on a map and found out a little bit about the city.

Can you find out a few interesting facts about the capital cities of the UK?

History

The children have continued to find out about toys from the past. They sorted a selection of toys into 'old' and 'new' and explained why they had classified them in this way. They created a timeline of toys, thinking carefully about how toys have changed. For example, in the past toys were often made from wood, metal and fabric. Newer toys are often made from plastic and are factory produced. Some toys are electronic and have batteries or are plugged in.

Your child can create a timeline of the toys they played with, starting from when they were a baby until the present day.
