

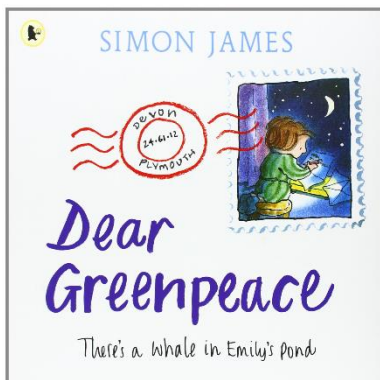
## **Weekly Learning Letter**

We will be focussing on these words which we have been practicing in class.

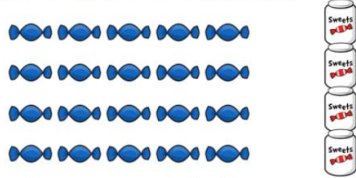
- driest
