This week in Nursery

The final week before the Easter holidays has been non-stop, full of fun and exploration! The children have enjoyed our new book, 'Oliver's Vegetables', discovering a variety of vegetables and trying out a different one from the book each day. Unfortunately, rhubarb has been somewhat elusive, so we're saving this for another day. The children have loved our tasting sessions and have used rich language to describe the taste, smell and texture of each vegetable. And believe it or not, peas have been a favourite! They have loved the newly converted Kilmorie market stall outside, selling and buying real veggies, weighing them out and putting them into paper bags for their customers, all the while calling out the requisite market stall patter!



Inside, they have been recreating their own versions of the story, introducing new vegetables to Oliver's grandad's veggie patch and even snakes! And of course, they've been finding out everyone's favourite vegetable using a tally sheet. In cooking, we made vegetable soup, with a rainbow of different vegetables including peppers, parsnips, red cabbage, potatoes, carrots, leeks, courgettes and onions and it was delicious! Thank you for your contributions to our soup kitchen this week.



As the sun has been shining again this week, there has been lots of water play in the outside area, using funnels, wheels and containers to channel and transport water. The children also helped build an intricate obstacle course incorporating the mini trampoline. Not only are the children demonstrating their increasing agility as they navigate the equipment, but also their growing patience, partaking in the great British tradition of orderly queueing whilst waiting their turn!



The caterpillars are finally in their cocoons busy metamorphosing into butterflies. We are hoping we get to see them emerge as butterflies before the end of term, but if not, we will film and share it with the children on our return.

As Easter approaches, we have also been learning about the Easter story and taking part in lots of fun Easter activities, including an extra cooking session making chocolate nests!
