

Weekly Learning Letter

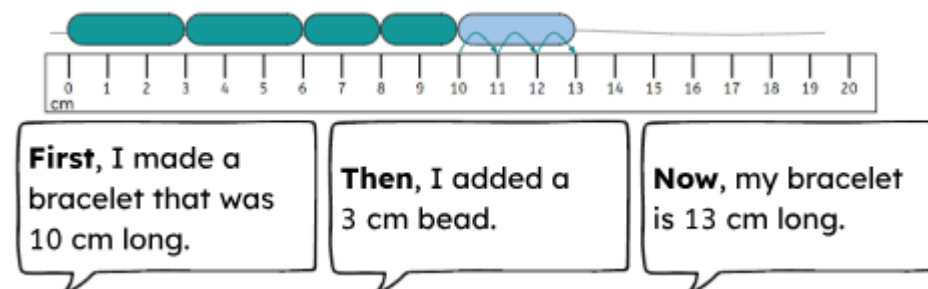
12th June 2026

It has been another busy week. This week is International Week at Kilmorie and we have been learning all about Jamaica, whilst longing for the sunshine to come back! We started by thinking about the connections we all have to other parts of the world and then we used a globe, atlases and google earth to figure out where Jamaica is in the world. We found out what the climate is like in Jamaica, why hurricanes happen and how the physical and human features of Jamaica compare to where we live. We introduced the children to Bob Marley, dreamed of going on holiday there and discovered the names of some of the amazing fruits that come from there. We even got to taste some. We have also enjoyed revisiting some of the Anansi stories because of their connection with the Caribbean.

Other learning this week:

Maths

This week in Maths we are still measuring and have moved on to measuring items in centimetres using a ruler and solving problems by measuring different lengths. When measuring, we remembered that you must always line up one end of the object with the zero on the ruler and place the object as close to the ruler as possible. We used 'First, Then, and Now' stories to help us solve problems like this one:
