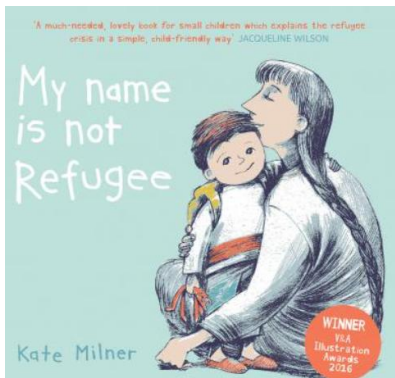


**Article of the Month**

Sometimes we will be with other people.

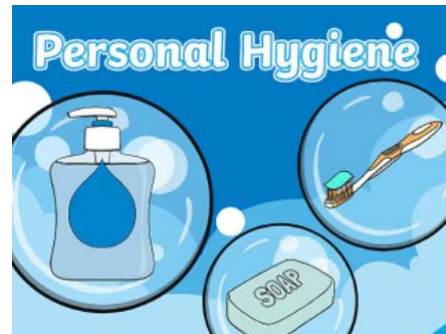

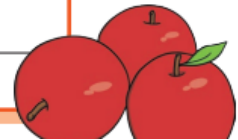

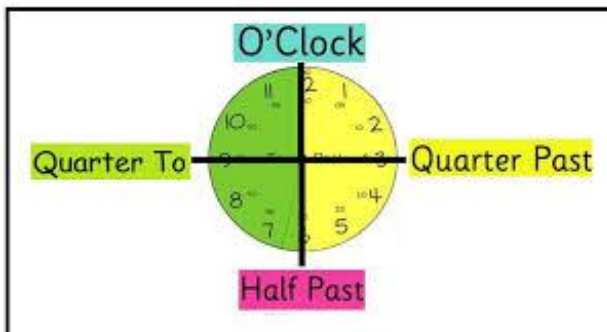
