Year 1 Home Learning

Welcome to Year 1! We are so excited about the year ahead.

We have been so impressed with how the children have settled into their new classes and would like to thank you for all your support.

Our weekly learning letter will let you know about the learning your child has been doing in class, and we will include some activities that you can do at home. If you have any questions, don't hesitate to ask your child's class teacher.

First full week!

We have been very busy getting used to the rules and routines. We have started our Art project – Curiosity and Kindness – and the work will be on display to view at Parent Teacher Meetings (week beginning 12th October).

Maths

This week the children have been joining in with counting in different ways- clapping stamping and chanting. We have been singing counting songs, building towers with cubes, and counting with different manipulatives. They have also practised writing numerals to 10.

Zones of Regulation

We have re-introduced the children to the Zones of Regulation. They have become more familiar with the different zones and the different feelings they may experience in each of the zones.

Rights Respecting School

Kilmorie is a Rights Respecting School where children's rights are learned, taught, practised, respected, protected and promoted. This week, each class had an opportunity to explore 6 of the 42 Articles of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). They then voted for 3 of these articles to include in their class charter.

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Important information

Reading: This week we have read with your child individually. They have been put into a reading group which will read up to 3 times a week. On Fridays, the book that they have been reading will be sent home in their book bag, along with a reading journal. We ask that you read this book with your child to support their reading journey and write any comments in the reading journal. Please return your child's book bag by Wednesday each week. Your child will also bring a book home from our class library. This is a book that you can enjoy reading to your child.

Please bring your child's book bag in on Monday 14th September so that books can be sent home next week.
