Home learning

Next week we will be looking at the maths skill of combining groups to find a total, which involves the language of addition, counting on to find a total and will be mostly practised using objects. You can support your child by using objects eg cutlery and rehearsing a problem such as;

"There are three forks on the table, how many will there be if I add three more? Can your child start from 3, then count on to find the total?" You could use any random objects – toy cars, minions, conkers, sweets...!

Phonics

This week we have been revising the sounds that we have covered so far. We have been blending when reading, and segmenting by writing words to match a picture. Practise robot talk with a range of CVC (consonant, vowel, consonant) words eg b-e-d, p-o-t, h-o-t. For an extension, you could use the next page to print off and your child can practise forming their letters to write the matching word.
